Partnership with WWF Sweden through WWF Madagascar

At the end of December 2008 a 'Convention de Collaboration' has been signed between WWF and HONCO. This agreement falls under 'the Toliara Land and Seascape Program' from WWF.

HONCO will provide technical expertise and management to help WWF restoring the degraded mangrove areas within the Bay of Ranobe. HONCO and WWF will work together to develop an awareness and education campaign to help safeguard these unique ecosystems in the future.



Start of construction of Community Mangrove Information Centre (CMIC)

After the well known, but frustrating, "tropical administration" (endless meetings, discussions, pointless waiting, and lots of follow-ups), HONCO was finally granted nearly 5 hectares and all the necessary permits towards the development of a Community Mangrove Information Centre on communal grounds of Belalanda. A lease has been agreed upon where HONCO will manage and develop the CMIC until local people have been trained to manage it themselves along with the future Community Protected Mangrove Reserve HONCO is working towards. The CMIC Sustainable living and resource management will be promoted and taught at . The local communities will also be able to hold meetings in the centre, as well as newly formed associations will be monitored through the CMIC.

Last but not least the MIC will also serve as an educational platform for visiting students and researchers, as well as an information centre for visiting tourists. The local commune will definitely benefit from the presence from the CMIC.
