2. Please explain any unforeseen difficulties that arose during the project and how these were tackled (if relevant).

We expected other funding that could support the physical contruction of the Harim Zone as Biodiversity Park that will cost 200% much more larger than the proposed grant we accepted from RSG, but then we did not successfully gain the funding. So we posponed the physical construction. We will continue this project in the next fiscal year with and approach to the Balai Lingkungan Hidup (BLH) Regency of Bogor which is willing to support this project. The facilitation and negotiation in supporting this work still on going and the expose to the Regency Secretary regarding the plan will be conducted in early July 2014.

3. Briefly describe the three most important outcomes of your project.

- 1. The design of the Harim Zone biodiversity as park (see http://www.ekopesantren.com/?p=236) is one of the important results since this is the first of its kind as a role model in other Islamic Boarding school. The design will be the best tool to convince further investment in helping the establishment of the biodiversity park. The design will be a model for the Islamic Boarding School which willing to establish similar method in increasing awareness and understanding to biodiversity.
- 2. The website www.ekopesantren.com as shared learning window of the project has been established. But the content of this website needs to be maintained for more informative and better view, we will be maintaining the web continually as the hosting and domain have been available up to 5 years.
- 3. This project has been a complmentary as part of another project with Islamic approach such as the Faith and Wildlife Program which UNAS has been work closely with Alliance of Religion and Conservation (ARC) on their Forest and Wildlife Program: http://www.arcworld.org/projects.asp?projectID=578. As part of the Faith and Conservation movement, UNAS has also succesfully to facilitate the Islamic Council of Ulama (MUI) to release Fatwa (Edict) on Endangered Wildlife Protection for the Balance of the Ecosystem (see: http://www.arcworld.org/projects.asp?projectID=65). We will continue to



disseminate the fatwa in partnership with other NGOs, such as WWF and Flora and Fauna International.

4. Briefly describe the involvement of local communities and how they have benefitted from the project (if relevant).

This project is becoming a show window of how an Islamic boarding school can contribute to increase biodiversity awareness trough Islamic teaching and their school programme. The school has been frequently used by several local as well ministry of forestry to launch their programme on conservation, such as planting tree programme and attract other Islamic Boarding Schools to learn of how the school can running their conservation and education activities in school.

5. Are there any plans to continue this work?

We will continue to work with faith (Muslim) community in Indonesia in a wide aspect of increasing awareness, because this scheme will also helping Indonesia in achieving global Aichi Target Goal A No 1, "that in 2020 that at the latest people aware of the value of biodiversity and the step they can take to conserve and use it sustanably". This project approach could be an alternate channel to increase biodiversity awareness in Indonesia society.

6. How do you plan to share the results of your work with others?

The work with Faith (Muslim) also attracted other international NGOs to involve with this approach, we started to collaborate with WWF Indonesia, Flora and Fauna International, the TigerForum and other related organisation in targeted Muslim awareness for conservation of biodiversity, not only on this area but also in the part of where protected wildlife are prone and threatened at their habitat, such as in Sumatra and Kalimantan. Fachruddin were invited to some international Forum to share experience such as:
