Lake Kanyaboli is one of the satellite lakes that form from the expansive Lake Victoria basin covering

Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania. It is a living museum and a refugium for haplochromine cichlids that have gone extinct in Lake Victoria and other parts of Africa. The lake therefore provides an opportunity for conservation of both genetic and trophic diversity which have been threatened by the introduction of exotics in the Lake Victoria basin, pollution and other anthropogenic activities.
