

## Project Update: May 2014

With the funds we have developed an outdoor environmental justice curriculum. This is for urban school students and is linked to the content of the national curriculum. Using a draft curriculum, on March 22nd 2014 a workshop for 21 teachers from selected primary and secondary schools in Hanoi was held. This provided training for teachers with hands-on activities (during the field trips), making connections between human health, the environment, and urban quality of life (after the field trips). Based on the workshop's results, CED then further finalised the curriculum in close consultation with school teachers and staff from Bavi and Tam Dao National Parks, and Melinh Biodiversity Station. From March 27<sup>th</sup> 2014 onwards a total of 329 students have joined the programme (including 232 primary and 97 secondary school children). CED will continue to refine the programmes based on feedback and assessments from all parties for future trips.
