

Project update: February 2015


The project effectively started on the 1st December 2014 with a 2-week training programme of team members on the planned activities and outlined methodology of the project.

Two reconnaissance surveys were carried out in January 2015 to the Kilum-Ijim forest reserve and the local communities surrounding the forest reserve. These communities included Aboh, Anyajua, Anjim and Dichamy in the Belo subdivision and Njikedjem, Kevu, Ibal Oku and Tolon in Bui Division. The reconnaissance survey aimed at familiarising with the local communities and village heads and also to inform them on the proposed activities with the community members. Presently we are setting up equipment for ethnomycological studies which is due to begin in March 2015. The first phase of this project was successfully executed.
