

Project Update: March 2016

In January 2016, we started the socio-cultural study, and we've completed nearly 100 surveys already, with the opinion of a variety of visitors to the Yeso Valley Park (cattlemen's family, hikers, researchers). During the last months we've continued monitoring nests and banded individuals of *Phegornis mitchellii* in the Yeso Valley. Also, we are making great progress in the elaboration of the outreach materials (signboard, video and triptych), in conjunction with the owners and the administrator of the property.

On May 27th 2015 we presented a poster for The Rufford Foundation Conference, Sudamérica 2015 (Quintay, Chile), in which we summarised the project development since 2010. Because of the publication of the project's information in the webpage of the NGO Birds and Wildlife Observers Network of Chile (<http://www.redobservadores.cl/actividades/investigacion/proyecto-chorlito-cordillerano-phegornis-mitchellii/>), we are still being notified about individuals of *P. mitchellii* banded by us in the Yeso Valley.
