

Project Update: September 2016

The dhole conservation awareness programme has been conducted in 170 households from Eusu block, 200 households from Sama geog, 198 households from Sangbaykha block, and 190 households from Gakiling block. During the gathering, participants were educated on importance of dhole in maintaining a balanced ecosystem as it is one of the top predators. Threats to dhole conservation, prey species of dhole and the morphological part of dhole was also presented to the participants. Groups were formed during the programme to discuss their perception of dhole conservation and their mitigation measures for human-dhole conflict. All the participants are provided with the working lunch, refreshment and daily subsistence allowance.
