

## Project Update: May 2016

In this second phase African wolf collaring was undertaken in Borena Syant National Park, Ethiopia. It is the continuous project from the first phase in another highland, Guassa Community Conservation Area, where we collared seven African wolves in April 2015. In this second phase, I collared seven more African wolves (three males and four females) with Ethiopian Wolf Conservation Program experts and Dr Alemayehu Lemma from College of Veterinary Medicine, Addis Ababa University from March 21<sup>st</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup> 2016. Currently, we have 14 collared African wolves from the two sites. Then after, collared wolves will be tracked for 18 months. Every collared individual will be followed twice per week for 24 hours with four field assistants.
