Project Update: September 2016

I have conducted questionnaire surveys, workshops and conservation awareness programmes in Rupandehi district, Nepal. The study areas were divided into four different sites: Adarsha amawa, Dhakadhai, Bhagawanpur and Makrahar. Community surveys with questionnaire were conducted using random sampling method and standard questionnaire form to 200 locals (50 from each site) including students, teachers and various people in community to find out the level of awareness among them. Inception workshop on snake, snakebite and snake conservation was conducted not only in the Rupandehi district, it is probably the first time in western Nepal. For the workshop programmes, I have coordinated with Shankarnagar Banbihar and Research Center, Kaligandaki Health Foundation, and Biodiversity Conservancy Nepal. Various members from different community forest, conservationists, different level of academicians' teachers and students, health personnel, media personnel from local and national newspapers, radios and televisions and different community people were invited in these workshops and awareness programmes.

- Rescued snake species.
- Conservation awareness programmes in various schools, colleges and communities.
- Snake conservation-related news in different newspapers, FM radios and television.
