

Project Update: July 2007

In the Supatá municipality and in the same relict of forest in when we discovered a new poison frog (Dendrobatidae: Ranitomeya), we locate a new population of the Pandi mushroom-tongue salamander (*Bolitoglossa pandi*) an endangered species of the cloud forests from the department of Cundinamarca.

This success is very important for the amphibian conservation because this salamander species was known only from the type locality in the Pandi municipality. The new population of this salamander exists in a little fragment of forest and now this species united to the new poison frog are threatened for the destruction of your habitat. The project Conservation of Critically Endangered amphibians from Colombia will make chats and environmental campaigns with the rural community in the zone for show the need of protect and conserve this relict of forest and the fauna and flora of this region.
