

Project Update: June 2017

1. Carnivore survey to assess the current status of carnivore species in the area for future conservation planning.

Under the Project “*Community Based Human-Carnivores Conflict Mitigation in Gehrata Gol Community Game Reserve Chitral, Pakistan*” a survey was conducted to assess the current status of carnivore species in the project area by using SLMS protocol. The members of local village conservation committee and a local wildlife watcher were also involved in the survey and before the survey the local VCC member and wildlife staff were trained and educated about SLMS protocol. During the surveys wildlife observed (signs and sighting) include wolf (*Canis lupus*), jackal (*Canis aureus*), fox (*Vulpus vulpus*), hare, (*Ovis oitulus*), marmots (*Marmota caudata*), snow cock (*Tetragallous himalayansis*), and chukar partridge (*Alectores chukar*). Wolf was quite abundant in Lawar, while scats of snow leopard were also noticed in *Palogho Dahar* area during the survey.
