

Project Update: January 2019

Mid-October to early December 2018, was a peak season for the stove distribution business due to different factors including the fact that the parents had finished taking children back to school and paying school fees thereby they could then save some money to buy stoves and they desperately needed to save fuelwood as the children who usually collect wood were busy at schools.

Approximately 2000 stoves have been distributed by the potters' cooperative so far. Nine potter bicyclists, cell office facilities, PPP Partners including Gisagara District Office, and private stove sellers/entrepreneurs have been the main actors in the distribution.

The stoves distribution campaign and recruitment of other actors/players still continue until 3000 stoves are installed in the local families. February is expected to be a pick season for distribution too.
