The conflict cause was quite complicated and have been confusingly addressed by local community, then it took more time than we thought to understand and finding the cause that led to the intensive conflict in some localities.

- 1. Provide understanding of the true conflict and cause for mitigation and help to address local concern.
- 2. Improving knowledge and technical expertise for the reserve staff and local stakeholders is the key to mitigate conflict in the long-term.
- 3. Having appropriate guidance for local community on how to behave and how to manage conflict.

4. Briefly describe the involvement of local communities and how they have benefitted from the project.

Our team strongly engaged with local community while implementing the project the engagement include:

- Participatory meetings and discussion on the conflict and option to mitigate from the perspective of local community.
- Participatory reviewing of the methods that are used by local community to chase away the elephant and how they react during the conflict.
- Work with local community to raise awareness on human-elephant conflict.



- Work with local school to provide more information on conflict and guide student how to react when they would meet an elephant or witness a conflict.
- Engage local community in regular discussion with local authority and the reserve on how to manage and mitigate conflict.

Having the information and skill then local community, especially students would know how to act and how they could help to mitigate the conflict within the household and spread the word to others in the community.

5. Are there any plans to continue this work?

Yes, we are discussing now with the reserve and local community to develop material that could be used at local community to raise awareness on elephant, wildlife conservation and how to manage human-wildlife conflict at local community. And we are planning to submit to Rufford for the second grant to continue this work.

6. How do you plan to share the results of your work with others?

We share the study finding in our website, fanpage. The project study report was also submitted to Dong Nai Province, Dong Nai Biosphere reserve and to commune authority (in Vietnamese) to inform management and urge for more attention on managing the critically endangered elephant population and managing the conflict more vigorous and more effectively.

We also share our report with many other researchers that interested in this study. They request our report and se did share with them via Email.

The project implemented in 2019 (3 months late than original plan). However, our team leader had maternity leave then the Covid-19, then one of our team member has to stay in quarantine and the social distancing regulation have made our reporting effort slower than we expected
