# Brief Overview of the **CONTEST**

Total number of participants = 27

Participants were residents of four villages named Saari, Makkumath, Mandal and Ransi located in and around the fringes of Kedarnath Wildlife Sanctuary in Uttarakhand, India.

The photographs were clicked in these locations nearby gardens, roadside vegetation, agricultural field, orchards or forest fringes.

All participants were males working as teachers, shopkeepers, businessmen, hoteliers, agriculturists, drivers, labours, tourist guides and students.

A total of 58 photographs received, out of which 29 were selected (based on accuracy of theme, picture quality etc.) corresponding to 6 participants, who were declared winners and awarded cash prize.

Majority (93%) photographs comprised of butterflies.




