

Project Update: December, 2018

The winter habitat condition of Bengal floricans was recorded in the permanent plots in the Koshi Tappu grassland. Similarly, a conservation awareness campaign on the importance of habitat management was conducted around the periphery of Koshi Tappu Wildlife Reserve, Nepal. Local people, stakeholders and staff of Koshi Tappu Wildlife Reserve were interviewed during the campaign. Video recording of their interviews has been created to use it for making an effective documentary so that it can be used for further conservation campaigns. In addition, a 3-day bird identification training session was conducted with 16 local participants, five students and 11 nature guides. Training was conducted in collaboration with Koshi Tappu Wildlife Reserve and Koshi Bird Society.
