

Project Update: July 2018

We have completed our study design for our field survey and have planned to start the field survey from mid-September, 2018. We completed our first conservation programme at Chitwan, Nepal. Three days of training was conducted at Chitwan on "Bird Identification and Photography Training". The training was organised in collaboration with Nepal Tourism Board. The training was technically supported by NTNC Sauraha and local organisations of Chitwan: Nature Guide Association, Bird Education Society and Tiger Conservation Sub-Committee. Altogether, 26 participants were selected for the training with 15 nature guides, six students and five locals. The bird identification training program at Sauraha has been postponed until October, 2018 due to the floods occurring at Koshi region. The conservation school program and bird identification training program will be conducted at Koshi Tappu Wildlife Reserve during October and November. 
