

Project Update: November 2018

In October, we did our second fieldwork in Guerrero. Same localities were visited as first sampling in August. We visit directly native people because they were waiting for us due we share tentative dates to next visit the village. In this occasion, we start immediately making the camp, define zones of traps where will run for days and invite people to join us.

We establish a light, fly interception, and net traps far from each other to avoid collect same representatives of leafhoppers. Also, we consider using different gradient of altitude for each trap. During our sampling, many people feel attracted to collaborate with us. We obtained some specimens and we took one of each morphospecies of leafhoppers in each locality, and count how much in total by each morphospecies were collected and what kind of methodology was trapped.

In October 18th I participate in the XX Symposium of Zoology of the University of Guadalajara, with oral presentation of the project in Sierra Madre del Sur, entitled as "Exploring the endemic leafhoppers (Hemiptera: Cicadellidae) in the mountain complex of the Sierra Madre del Sur; an approach towards its conservation"
