

Project Update: August 2022

To date, community training has been carried out in relation to native bees, agroecological practices and coexistence with the fauna and flora typical of the tropical dry forest and in parallel, with the support of local organisations and the community, it is producing and planting plant material of native species of the tropical dry forest. Additionally, work has been done on the image and informative material on the Meliponario within the Uraku Nature Reserve.

Finally, tours have been carried out for the establishment of the Meliponario through which training and contemplation activities will be developed for educational institutions and the community in general.
