

Project Update: August 2010

In July 2010, we completed the administration of questionnaires to tradipractitioners, ending up with 62 respondents, and a temporary indication that some 56 wildlife species can be applied for 53 medicinal usages. The data analysis so far indicates that species listed as “totally protected” in Cameroon legislation or “endangered” by IUCN rating, and extinct in the study area (for some) rank higher as medicinal wildlife species.

In August 2010, following analysed data so far, we produced 500 posters of MEDICINAL WILDLIFE SPECIES OF CAMEROON’S NORTH WEST REGION, for further awareness campaigns.

CIRMAD, a local conservation NGO funded for 50 more of the posters, besides assistance in getting pictures and ranking of some of the species in the study site.
