## **Project Update: March 2008**

The following activities were accomplished:

## a) Creating awareness using posters

Posters were designed about growing Prunus africana to conserve Kalinzu-maramagambo forest.

#### Contents of the posters:

Uses of Prunus africana, Causes of Prunus africana degradation, Inadequate knowledge, Cultural practices, Poverty and lack of alternatives

# b) Trainings on nursery bed establishment

Trainings on nursery bed establishment were conducted in two selected community-based organizations of Bitereko women's group in Bitereko Sub County (with 150 members) and Katanda II in Katerera Sub County (with 200 members) in March 2008.

## Content of training:

Seed quality management (seed source identification, processing and storage), Nursery management practices (sowing, soil mixing and other silvicultural practices in nursery bed), Pest disease control and management in tree nurseries, Nursery records management, Nursery planning and designing calendar, Practice in seed quality and nursery management techniques and Sustainable harvesting of Prunus africana
