

Project Update: July 2011

Training Wehea rangers as para-biologists continued during July and early August 2011. Training focused on developing an independent programme for on-going biodiversity monitoring and data management. The rangers learned how to monitor camera traps, organise data collected from the camera traps and write reports. Initial results from this camera trapping study support our conclusion that the Wehea Forest is a biologically rich and important forest. Independent monitoring of the camera traps by the Wehea rangers will continue from August 2011 to March 2012. Work in July also focused on increasing national and international awareness through digital media about the efforts of the Wehea Dayak to protect their forest.
