handao means let's do it! in Malagasy

1. at a glance

ho avy means **future** in Malagasy and safeguarding biodiversity and people's livelihoods for future sustainability is the focus of this grassroots program in southwestern Madagascar. Ho avy is a collaborative effort between a Czech-based civic association '**ho avy** o.s.' and the USA-based organization **New Latitude** (www.newlatitude.org), which receives 501 [c](3) non-profit status as a project of IHCenter (<http://ihcenter.org>). Ho avy's Malagasy counterpart is **FIMPAHARA**, a rural community association which is dedicated to the propagation and reforestation of native plants.

2. fresh from the field

ho avy's return to Ranobe (our pilot field site), was welcomed warmly and felt genuinely touching: "Welcome back home!" we could hear around the village. Delightful was the first view of our very well maintained nursery/sanctuary that has been managed by **FIMPAHARA** over the last 10 months; truly prosperous despite the serious drought this year. FIMPAHARA has taken a dedicated lead in the sanctuary and we celebrated this wonderful progress by handing out laminated ID cards, which were accepted with grace. FIMPAHARA members confidently confirmed their ongoing motivation: "**We have reached so far, and we want to keep going**". The forest is lush, green and beautiful, baobabs are flowering, chameleons and birds are abundant...

3. hamboly hazo! ... expanding!

- this season **FIMPAHARA** took **spontaneous action** in tree and vegetable planting and monitoring:
- **342** native trees of **28** species grow happily in the sanctuary, 2 species are used as **food** and 10 species have **medicinal values**
- **325** trees of **15** species are kept in the nursery ready for **transplanting**
- **additional 526** seeds of **13** species were planted in nursery beds in 2009: nearly **1000 new trees** are growing in the sanctuary in **less than one year**

4. compost is the key!

in the arid sands of southwest Madagascar, soils can be easily and greatly improved by composting. Building up on last year's successful trial with soil improvements, **FIMPAHARA** took charge and expanded the composting operations.

The trimmings from rice straw and the ever available zebo (cow) dung, turned an area of (1.5 x 1.5 m) into a live compose site, ready for improving soils and food production!

promising a vision of success

Like the baobabs, **FIMPAHARA** continuously grows and is expressing great enthusiasm, and independent approaches to taking the lead on **ho avy's** alternative and participatory education program. Collecting seeds, growing plants and maintaining the nursery/sanctuary has been adopted and become part of **FIMPAHARA's** daily life. **FIMPAHARA** has expressed great interest in long-term collective projects with **ho avy**.



5. towards our goals

- ho avy** is investing our energies in:
- **empowering** communities especially women and children, for their **future**:
 - **implementing** creative learning and training courses in agro-forestry, organic gardening and permaculture
 - **growing** more **food** plants
 - setting up **water cleaning** and **sanitation** stations
 - **developing** alternative sources of cooking energy with solar ovens and biofuel
 - **incentive** micro-business livelihoods, e.g. selling surplus vegetables, biofuel
 - **promoting** advocacy at the local and national level
 - **raise next generation** of qualified researchers and natural resource managers, starting with **ho avy's** first alumni: **Claude Manarina** (left on the photo below).

6. new prospective partnerships

- discussions with **Conservation International** revealed great mutual interest in partnership through CI's Conservation Stewards Program
- **WWF** proposed possible formal jurisdiction and forest management at **ho avy/FIMPAHARA's** representative site in the village of Ranobe
- **HONCO**, a local mangrove restoration project is keen on sharing education, nursery, restoration, and sustainability approaches...
