1- T.M.A GROUP IN AMBODIVOANGY:



Bernard: President of TMA Ambodivoangy

TMA stands for "Tantsaha Mamokatra Ambodivoangy" or "productive farmers of Ambodivoangy". Originally established as a farmers' group by the Wildlife Conservation Society in 2007, TMA has been working with SEPALI since 2009. TMA was the first group of farmers to join SEPALI.

TMA consisted of only 5 members when they first began working with SEPALI, but the group was immediately productive. Only one week after the training program, TMA set up a group nursery for the silk host plant (Talandoha) and each member planted 1000 seedlings. After 6 months, the TMA members started to transplant the Talandoha seedlings onto their land. Currently, the group registers 13 members and continues to grow.

2- F.T.A GROUP IN MAROVOVONANA:



Ambohisoa" or "farmers' association of Ambohisoa", and has been working with SEPALI since June 2009. Originally a group of 10 farmers, the group has progressively grown to a membership of 25 over the past two years.

FTA also has a cooperative tree nursery. In addition to growing the wild silk host plant, the farmers also have several species of trees such as Cloves, coffee and fruit trees. During the meeting with FTA in May, each member promised to plant 250 seedlings on their land before August.

FTEA stands for "Fikambanana Tsara Ezaka Ambalamahogo" or "the persistent group of Ambalamahogo", and has been working with SEPALI since 2009. FTEA currently consists of 17 members and will likely continue to grow as there are still many farmers in the community interested in joining the group.

FTEA members have already transplanted ~1000 trees and are currently preparing a new batch of seedlings for the nursery.

At this stage of the project, SEPALI has provided all seeds and seedlings to the communities. Before the end of the year, each farmer must finish transplanting 250 seedlings on their land in order to obtain SEPALI membership.

FTTFA stands for "Fikambanana Tantsaha Tia Fandrosoana Ambodivoangy" or "group of farmers interested in development". The group was created in July 2009 and currently registers 19 members. The original members of the FTTFA are ready to transplant mature seedlings to their land and new members are continuously adding enthusiasm and momentum to the group.

Many members have already received plastic planting containers from SEPALI and are currently working on producing Talandoha seedlings. By the end of the month, each member will have planted 250 seedlings in their nursery. FTMTA is a popular group and membership continues to increase.
